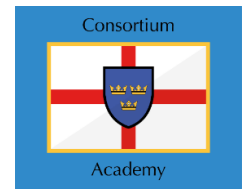

THIS WEEK IN CLASS

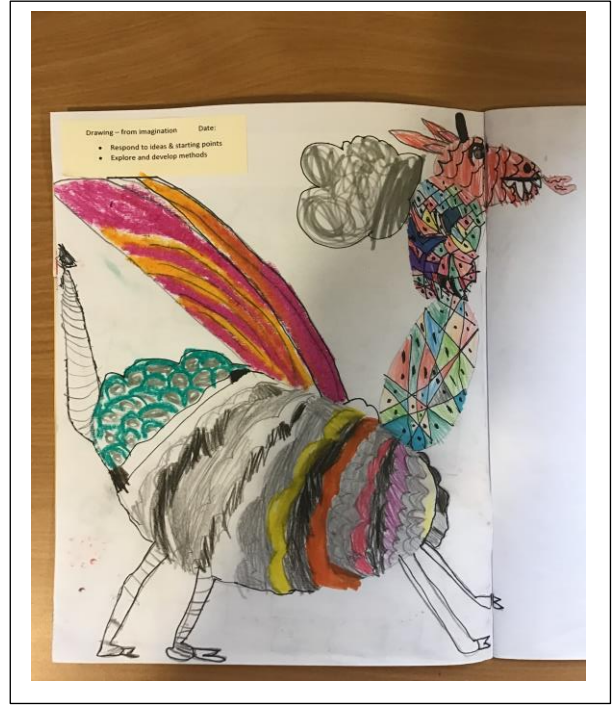
ROBIN CLASS

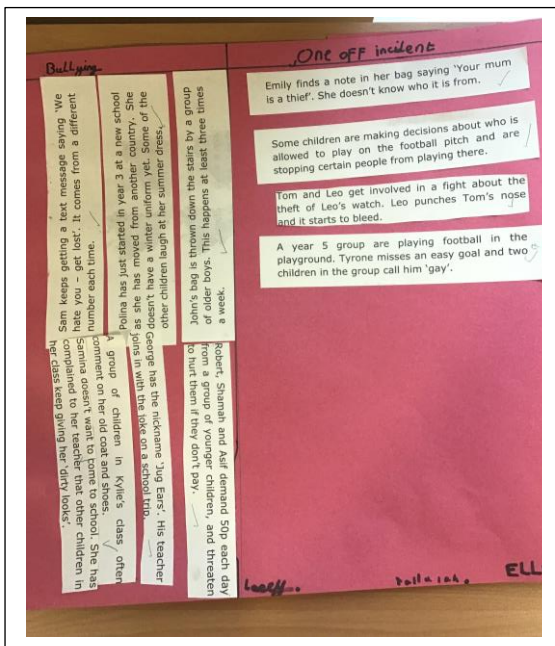
WOODPECKER CLASS
