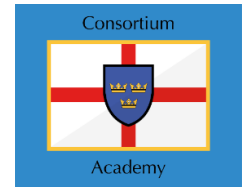

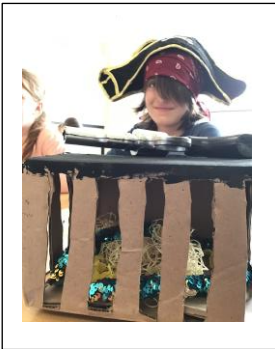
Robins
