Class News

Robins

In Maths this week Robins have been learning about pairing and sorting. We have learnt how to play pairs, had a treasure hunt around the classroom looking for matching pairs and have learnt how to categorise and sort groups of objects and people using different characteristics.

Thank you for all the autumn bags which were returned this week. We have used items from the bags to print and paint with in art and have sorted the leaves by shape, colour and size in Maths.

Woodpeckers

This week children have been busy planning and writing their own tales based on the structure of the text Odd Dog Out. Children were developing their basic writing skills and reminded to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. We look forward to sharing our stories in class early next week.

In maths we have focussed on counting in 10's, 5's and 2's and linked this learning to the work we did on place value when writing 2-digit numbers. We completed number sequences and looked for patterns on a 100 square.

Children have enjoyed listening to the poem 'The Jumblies' and discussing the text in their Whole class reading sessions. They were asked to discuss what they thought the poem was about and identified words that rhyme in each verse.

Red Kites

This week Red Kites have been using the learning characteristics participation, build links and independent learners this week with creating a moon diary. Last week our Science was identifying the moon and its orbit. Red Kite class independently created a diary to identify the lunar phase of the moon and were also able to identify when the moon had risen and when it had set.







Starlings

This week in English, Starlings have been building their story map for our new class text 'The Rabbits'. We have collaborated to create a sequence of symbols to help us remember our text. In small groups, we have started to perform gestures and actions to match those symbols, and eventually we will merge all of our ideas into one routine. This will give us the foundations we need for our writing 'box up' next week.
