TikTok has now raised its Livestreaming Age Requirement to 18 (BBC News)

# Woodpeckers

Woodpecker class have continued learning about Seasons in Science this week. We recapped the names of the seasons and the changes that are made to the environment during them before discussing how the number of daylight hours varies throughout the year. We linked this to sequencing the months of the year and finding out which month is in which season. Children then made seasons wheels to show what they remembered.





### **Robins**

In outdoor learning this week, Robins have been learning about the life cycle of flowers and have planted some bulbs at the front of school which they learned will not flower until spring. We wondered what else has a life cycle?

We have also been busy making props and rehearsing for our nativity and are getting very excited about performing it to our grown ups soon.

### **Red Kites**

This week as part of our science topic 'How can we prevent water diseases'. Red Kite class have been building links and being independent learners in researching osmosis and the different types. We also recapped on the uses of water within our homes and discussed if we would manage without running water in our homes.

Next week we will curious learners as we test the PH levels in different types of fresh and bottled waters.







## **Starlings**

Following on from last week's amazing experiment, Starlings were tested through a series of quizzes to see if they could recall their digestion facts. They then articulated the process of digestion in their books, talking through each stage of the experiment - like an instructions manual. Next week in Science, we will be looking at the skeletal system and exploring the question 'What would happen if humans did not have a skeleton?'.
