

Curriculum Overview Red Kite Class Spring term

English

Our writing this term will focus on persuasive texts and writing to inform. We will be looking at a range of features we can use in our writing to make it engaging to the reader. Red Kite class will be creating a campaign for a change they would like to happen for their piece of persuasive writing. We will also be looking at a range of poems and picking out features used in them. After gaining valuable knowledge, students will be able to draft their own poems adding their own creative flare to them.

In whole class reading we will continue to work on our comprehension skills. Our class novel this term will be Cosmic by Frank Cottrell-Boyce. Students will be using this as their whole class reading focus three days a week. We will be looking at a range of skills including prediction and inference. Do we think Liam and Florida will win the competition and go to space?





Mathematics

As well as revisiting our previous learning through our daily challenges and starter activities. We will be looking at a range of topics including fractions, angles, interpreting data and measurements. We will also be looking at a range of SAT's questions to prepare ourselves for the summer term.

Science

We will begin our unit of work on 'How do Forces impact on our lives everyday?' During this topic we will be identifying the types of forces including gravity and water resistance. We will be undergoing a range of science investigations as well as testing our knowledge and understanding.



<u>PE</u>

Our PE sessions will be on Tuesday afternoons so please can students remember their PE kits including a pair of trainers. We will also continue to swim on Wednesday mornings.

This term we will be focusing on both carnival dance and the non invasion ball game netball.

PSHE / RSE

We will be looking at the focus 'what are our dreams and goals'. As a class we will be identifying what it takes to be successful and whether we think it is important to have goals.

<u>RE</u>

The topic for RE this term is 'what difference does the resurrection make to Christians?' We will be identifying what the bible says about the resurrection and linking it to the beliefs of Christians and looking at if it fits in with other

<u>Music</u>
