

Class News

Woodpeckers

This week has been another busy week in Woodpecker class. As well as completing their information texts in writing, children have been discussing the importance of having a positive mindset and how this helps them to achieve their goals. We made links to the characteristics of learning and had a go at some quite tricky tasks like tongue twisters and word searches. Ask your child if they persevered or gave up after the first attempt!

Starlings

In PSHE this week, we discussed ways in which we can overcome challenges and manage disappointment in our lives - especially in relation to goals. We explored the topic of mindsets and the difference between having a growth mindset and a fixed mindset. In groups, Starlings choreographed some role play to demonstrate how having a positive attitude can help you tackle obstacles. One group showed a young girl, who became overwhelmed with her maths test and wanted to quit until a friend arrived and supported her. Another group showed two pupils trying to play a musical instrument and struggling, with one pupil adopting a growth mindset and other other a fixed mindset.
