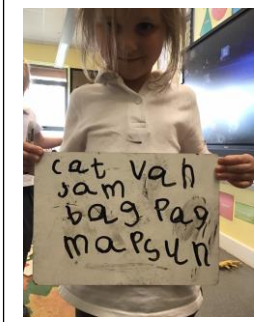
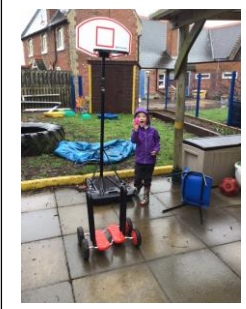
Robins
