






## Curriculum Overview Starlings Class Summer 2023








**Reading:** Starlings' class text this half-term is 'Desirable' by Frank Cottrell-Boyce. It revolves around George, a social reject who is given some old aftershave by his grandad. This aftershave has a strange effect and causes George's popularity to increase. Starling class will discuss their theories and predictions. We will also be reading 'Song of the Dolphin Boy' by Elizabeth Laird. We follow Finn on a strange adventure involving the wild ocean and connections to dolphins. This text, among others will be

studied as part of our Global citizenship theme.





Science: This term. Class 3 are investigating light, forces and magnets. We will explore the absence of light, UV rays and shadows. In Summer 2, we will investigate push and pull, repel and attract and friction.

PE: This term in PE we will be testing our ball skills through bench ball and volleyball. Our focus is control using different throwing techniques, such as the chest pass. In summer 2, we will be preparing for sports day through exploring different athletics.

**Geography:** In Geography this term, Starling class will be learning all about natural disasters and their impact. We will be studying the cause and devastation of volcanoes and earthquakes using different case studies, including the eruption in Pompeii.

**ODL:** This term, in ODL, Starling class will be enhancing the outdoor area with a big revamp - developing DIY and creative skills. Class 3 will also be learning about tie-dye and printing using the outdoor

environment as inspiration.

Music: In Music, Starlings will be learning how to play 'God Save the King' on the Glockenspiel in celebration of the Coronation. Starlings' will also continue to develop their skills in rhythm, pitch, tempo and control.



RE: This term, we will be learning about the way Muslims live. Starling class will study the Five Pillars of Islam, with a special focus on the Shahadah. We will be exploring Muslim traditions and diversity of cultures.
