Message from Mrs Softley – Robins Class

Robins have had a fantastic week of learning this week. In drawing club, we have been using the text *The Colour Monster* which has provoked some fantastic discussions about how we see our emotions in colour and the key stage 1 children have produced some excellent writing about a thief who stole one of the emotions jars and the Colour Monster's adventure to get it back. Our early years children have been looking at colour and how we can mix colours together to make new colours and thinking about using colour to make a repeating pattern.

Message from Mr Lamoureux – Red Kites Class

This week, the children have been making great progress in their learning! In English, they have been using expanded noun phrases and adverbs to make their writing more descriptive and engaging. In maths, we have been representing and partitioning 3- and 4- digit numbers in different ways, helping the children to understand the value of each digit. In science, we explored the five food groups and seven key nutrients, discussing how different foods help our bodies stay healthy and strong. It would be wonderful to continue these conversations at home and hear about the foods and nutrients you include in your family meals.
