As you may be aware, Glebeland is part of the national PINS programme. As part of this work, Family Action Norfolk professionals, together with colleagues from the wider health and care system, are running parent–carer engagement sessions to hear directly from families about their experiences navigating neurodevelopmental differences in education. These sessions are intended to offer a safe, welcoming space where families can explore practical ways of working effectively with schools.

Robins have had another very busy week this week. Key Stage 1 children visited Norwich on Tuesday to learn more about Florence Nightingale at the Bridewell museum and to visit Edith Cavell's grave at Norwich Cathedral. They also managed to sneak in a visit to Paddington while they were in the Cathedral grounds!

Early years children have been very excited by the change in the weather this week and have enjoyed exploring ice outside and seeing their "dragon" breath. Please ensure all children have warm coats, hats, gloves etc every day as we will be outside whatever the weather.

In Drawing Club this week, we have been exploring Roadrunner and have been thinking about different ways Coyote could catch them and things we could invent to help. Key stage 1 children have extended this by starting to use adjectives in the writing to add description and make their writing more

interesting.

Message from Mr Lamoureux – Red Kites Class

Red Kites Class have been working hard across all subjects this week! In English, we have been innovating our model text by changing parts of the recount using our own ideas. In maths, we completed our addition and subtraction topic and have now moved on to multiplication and division, soon will be the perfect time to support learning at home with Times Tables Rockstars. In science, we explored the circulatory system and learned about the functions of the heart, lungs and blood vessels. On Wednesday, we welcomed lots of children from different schools to Glebeland and we took part in Pupil Parliament Day, where we learnt about biodiversity and debated the questions, are humans having a negative impact on biodiversity and are school spaces suitable environments for nature to thrive. On top of all this, the children demonstrated a purposeful and determined attitude during their reading assessments.
