



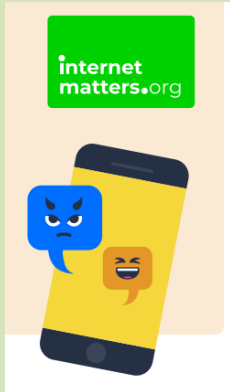

#### E-safety and Cyber-bullying



Online safety is very important. We have filtering and monitoring at Glebeland to safeguard children, when accessing online learning. At home, online games and apps have age limits for parental guidance. We have recently been using NSPCC age-appropriate resources to talk about ways we can be hurt and have discussed bullying and what to do if you or someone else is being bullied. We have talked about safe adults whom children can go to in our school. Cyber-bullying is an increasingly pernicious problem, and it is important to raise awareness and give children the tools to stay safe online. Key Stage 1 children have been investigating Alexander Graham Bell and looking at how telephones have changed over time. They were amazed at how big a mobile phone used to be!

In PSHE, we have been considering how to talk to grown-ups we don't know and what to do if a stranger talks to us in a way which makes us feel uncomfortable. We learnt to Yell! Run! Tell and discussed who our safe grown-ups are to talk to and where safe places might be to run to when we are out and about.

In Drawing Club, we have been reading the story *Aliens love underpants* this week and have invented new ways for the aliens to travel home when their spaceship broke down and a machine to make Grandad some new underpants!

We have had a busy and brilliant week in Red Kites! In English, we have finished our non-chronological reports. In Maths, we tackled some tricky learning, including dividing 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers and showing great resilience along the way.

In Science, we added open and closed switches to our circuits to explore how electricity flows. In Art, we compared symmetrical and non-symmetrical faces and created our own drawings.
