As this week is Children's mental health awareness week, we have taken time each day to be mindful and to give ourselves and our friends affirmations and compliments. We have had a kindness tree in the classroom to write each other kind messages and draw pictures of our friends.

In maths this week, early years children have been starting to measure objects and compare them. We drew around our feet to see what we could find which was longer and shorter than our foot and we compared heights by seeing who is the tallest and shortest in the class and measured the heights of objects using cubes. Key stage 1 children have been learning to solve multiplication calculations and will begin work on division after half term.
