Message from Mrs Softley – Robins Class

Robin class have had a fantastic week celebrating world book week. We have based our learning this week around the book *The Everywhere Bear* by Julia Donalson and have learnt to use descriptive language to make LOST posters and have imagined where else he could end up on an adventure and how he could travel back to school.

We have enjoyed sharing books with our peers in class and from Red Kites and have also had lots of different adults read to us this week. We enjoyed swapping books in our book swap and dressing up on Thursday and reading with some of our adults.

In continuous provision, the early years children have explored comparing size and sharing with porridge for the three bears and have been using their scissor skills to cut Goldilocks hair. We have also

been making bear masks and have started creating a big barn to turn part of the classroom into a farm and a farm shop.

Key stage 1 children have been exploring materials to learn about transparent, translucent and opaque and in maths have been learning the 10- and 5-times table and division between 5 and 10.

We are very excited for our trip to the Science Museum on Friday and are looking forward to celebrating Science week next week.

Message from Mr Lamoureux– Red Kites Class

This week has been packed with reading and book related activities as we celebrated World Book Week. There was a lot of enthusiasm for stories and books throughout the classroom. The rest of the week has included working hard to write our own diary entries about the Great Fire of Glebeland, imagining what it might have been like to experience such an event. In Maths, we have been learning how to measure using metres, centimetres and millimetres, practising how to read and record measurements accurately. In Science, we explored how sound is made, learning that sound is created through vibrations. In design and technology we began investigating torches, identifying their different components and discussing which materials would be best to use when designing and making our own. We also had the chance to get creative by making some pressed flower bookmarks. To add even more fun to the week, we even managed to play tennis in our World Book Day costumes. To finish off the week, we headed to Norwich science museum in preparation for Science week next week! Well done to everyone for your hard work, effort and enthusiasm throughout the week.
