Their first challenge was to use different materials and adhesives to mend a hole in a bucket and assess the best combination.


They learned the importance of only changing one variable in order to achieve accurate results for comparison.


They are looking forward to their next 'sticky' challenge on Monday

We have been writing our own stories based on 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' Our stories are called 'A Sailor's Outing'






Class 3
