We will be starting the year by settling in and learning the rules and routines of our new school. for PE and outdoor learning. We will be exploring We will play listening games and learn to take turns and share. Physical development

We will learn how to correctly hold a pencil to begin forming recognisable letters and then practise letter formation daily.

We will try a healthy range of foods and snacks and learn about different ways to stay healthy.
