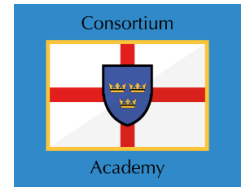

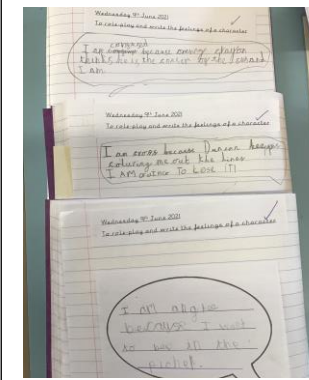
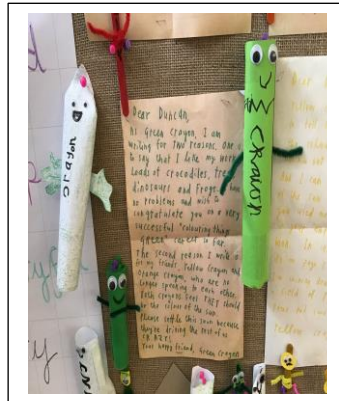
## Class 1

This week Class 1 have been enjoying the story 'Billy's Bucket'. We used our imaginations to write about what we would see in a special bucket like Billy's



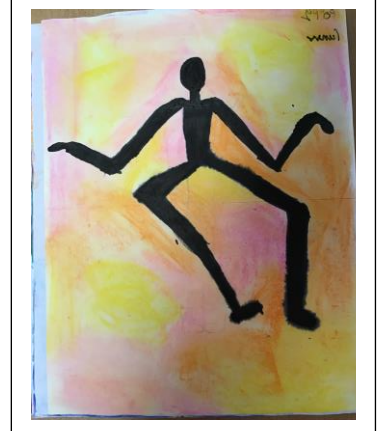
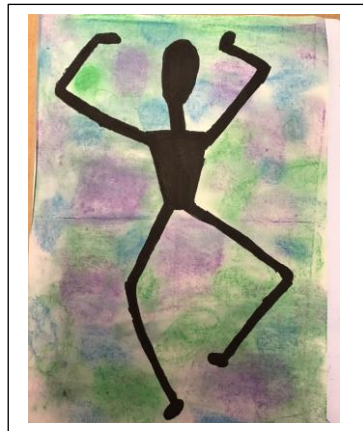
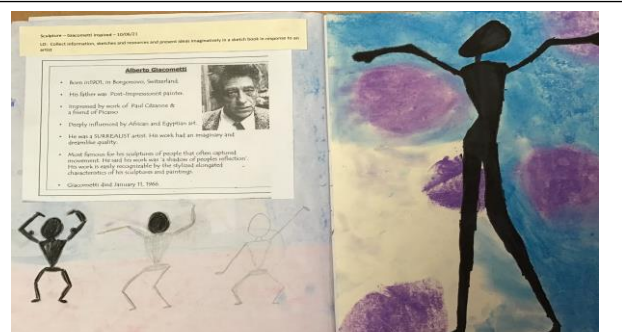
## Class 2
